PALM SUNDAY OF THE LORD'S PASSION

April 14, 2019

“Let us go forth in peace, praising Jesus our Messiah, as did the crowds who welcomed him to Jerusalem.” (*Today's liturgy*)

Dear Sisters and Brothers, members of St. James and St. Margaret parishes,

Today is known as Passion Sunday and as Palm Sunday. These two titles underline contrasting themes. The reading of the Passion draws attention to the human suffering and death-agony of Jesus. But the palms express the triumphal entry of Jesus to Jerusalem. These two titles remind us that the events of the Holy Week form a story which must be read on the two levels of human suffering and divine triumph. The memorial of Jesus' triumphal entrance into Jerusalem will be included in every Mass. We will gather together in the entrances of our Churches for the blessing of the palms and after the Gospel reading, imitating Jesus entrance to the Holy City we will enter the Sanctuary to continue the Liturgy of the Passion.

Palm Sunday is, as it were, the door that precedes and prepares us for the Paschal Triduum. “Now that we are at the threshold of Holy Week, and so very close to the moment when the Redemption of the whole human race was accomplished on Calvary, it seems to be especially appropriate time for you and me to reflect on how our Lord Jesus Christ saved us, and to contemplate this love of his—**this truly inexpressible love**—for poor creatures like us, who have been made from the clay of the earth.”



Palm Sunday begins the celebration of the Holy Week. The most important days of the Holy Week are: **Holy Thursday; Good Friday and**

Easter Vigil followed by Easter Sunday. Holy Triduum ends with the Evening Prayer on Easter Sunday.

I hope all of you will make time to celebrate these most holy days of the Liturgical Year:

HOLY THURSDAY - St. Margaret Church at 7:00 PM – **MASS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER**, with the ceremony of the Washing of Feet. After Holy Communion the Eucharistic Procession to the place of the Reposition of the Blessed Sacrament, followed by adoration until 9:30 PM. **Opportunity for confession after the procession.** God, who is absolute power, does not want to trample on us, but kneels down before us so as to exult us.



GOOD FRIDAY- Celebration of the Lord's Passion: The image of the crucified Christ, which is the focal point of Good Friday liturgy, makes us realize the true seriousness of human misery, loneliness and sin. Yet this image has been constantly regarded as an image of consolation and hope.
