Fifth Sunday In Ordinary Time Sunday, February 10, 2019

O come, let us worship God and bow low before the God who made us, for he is the Lord our God.

Entrance Antiphon

Greetings Brothers and Sisters of St. James' and St Margaret's Parishes,

The scripture selections for the Fifth Week in Ordinary Time highlight the calls of three major biblical figures, Isaiah, Paul, and Simon Peter. Interestingly all three individuals come to the realization of their personal sinfulness and unworthiness, Despite their self-recognized state, it is the intervention of Almighty God which provides the grace needed for each of them to respond accordingly, and fulfill their particular mission to serve God and His people.

In St. Luke's Gospel, Jesus after preaching to the crowds from the fishing boat implores Simon and his crew to go out and cast their nets once again to fish in deeper waters. Simon contends that after working hard all night they caught nothing but at Jesus' command follows His instructions, which results in a catch so great they needed assistance from other boats to haul it in. Jesus announces that Simon will become a "Fisher of Men!" Upon coming to shore, Simon, James and John all dropped their nets and from that point followed Jesus.

When we read the text in St. Luke's Gospel prior to this selection we find Jesus at Capernaum performing miracles in the synagogue and teaching with authority, Jesus then goes to Simon Peter's house and cure's his mother in-law. Jesus apparently impacted the minds and hearts of those men for them to drop everything and follow Him. First century people in Palestine largely relied on the security of living and working in a clan type of setting to guard from dangers and preserve economic stability. It was a courageous decision for Simon Peter, James and John to leave their means of living, homes and families to follow Jesus.

Perhaps in not to the same extreme, we too are called to follow Jesus, let us look to the example of Simon Peter, James and John as a reminder, following Jesus requires us to move out of our comfort zone to some extent. Quite often our personal call from the Lord requires us to let go of and move away from patterns and habits which hold us back, and form new practices, that run in accord with the Gospel to fully become a disciple of Christ. Being a disciple of Christ has its challenges, what we receive back is a peace that only Jesus Christ can give.

The peace that I am speaking of is a consistent peace. This doesn't mean once a disciple of Christ, adversity and trouble cease, no they'll come, but what I mean is that as a disciple of Christ we can meet those afflictions head on with the confidence in God we find true happiness, and no matter what happens, He will provide the graces we need to work through

the difficult times. As well, with the peace that only Christ can give, the joys we experience in life are much more fulfilling. We know all good things come from the Lord, and he has a vested interest in every human being's happiness.

We shouldn't fear becoming a disciple of Jesus Christ. Consider this excerpt from the Book of Jeremiah. "For I know well the plans I have in mind for you," says the Lord. "Plans for your welfare and not for woe, so as to give you a future of hope."
